**Original Research:** Generally less than 3,000 words, but longer papers will be accepted if the context warrants the inclusion of more text (see *Med Educ* 2010; 44:432). An abstract, structured

under subheadings, of no more than 300 words must be included and the paper should contain a maximum of five tables or figures with references included in the Vancouver style. The paper will usually be organised using the Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion (IMRAD) structure. The introduction should include a strong conceptual framework that indicates how publication of the paper can be expected to fill a gap in knowledge that is important for the field to fill. The context of the work and your choice of methods must be made clear. Qualitative and quantitative research approaches are equally welcome. All papers must also clearly articulate how the findings should be interpreted and how they advance understanding of the issue under study. See *Med Educ* 2009; 43:294-6.
