

Innovation, Implementation, Improvement

Articles in this section allow authors to demonstrate scholarly approaches to health professions education design, implementation and evaluation. We particularly welcome articles that describe the design and/or implementation of a teaching and learning initiative, evaluation studies and papers showcasing the use of implementation science and quality improvement methodologies.

The implications of the work, and its relevance to health professions educators and students who work outside of the context wherein the initiative took place, should be explicit along with a summary of what worked well, or what could be done differently to improve the effectiveness of the innovation or initiative.

Articles should all contain explicit confirmation of ethical approval (or exemption from same) as per *The Clinical Teacher* guidelines.

Format

1. The word limit for articles in this section is **1500**
2. Articles should generally be structured using the following headings
 - Background
 - Approach
 - Evaluation
 - Implications
3. A structured **abstract** of **250** words should accompany the article (using the same headings)
4. Article **titles** should be no longer than **ten words** (50 characters including spaces)
5. Each article may include up to **5 tables, boxes or figure**
6. Referencing is in the Vancouver style and each article should have a maximum of **15 references**
7. The manuscript should be double-spaced with a wide margin (at least 3 cm) on either side. The writing should be clear and concise and we encourage the use of short sentences and the active voice

Figures, boxes, tables and images are a feature of *The Clinical Teacher* and there is room for at least one of these per 400 words of text; these should be included on separate pages at the end of the paper with their suggested placement noted in the text.

We actively seek high quality, digital images that pertain to the paper and these should be uploaded as separate files. 1-2 colour photographs which illustrate the text are particularly welcome

Submission

Authors should upload a full version of the manuscript including a title page with author and corresponding author details, as well as an anonymised version for review that should not contain any details which could identify the authors to the reviewers, such as names of authors or institutions or country or region information.

For accepted papers pull-outs for the article will be requested; these are brief verbatim quotes from the paper, each approximately 10-18 words. These pull-outs can be used to highlight your key messages and will be published alongside your article.

Important information

- The text of the summary should not replicate the introduction as they will be printed together
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
